Range Manager Team



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- 1. **Rifle Range Monitor** Spend ½ day at the range, plan to do some shooting yourself, keep an eye on range users, check for their current membership and adherence to policies and posted safety procedures. Clean up range.
- **2. Spring/Fall Work Day worker** specialized or general cleanup/fixit labor. Organize jobs, plan and obtain needed materials and tools (paint, hardware, power washer, chainsaw, etc.)
- **3.** League Trap Shoot Helper score squads, load houses, signup shooters, or run the kitchen at shoots.
- **4. Communication Committee** using membership call lists contacts members using phone tree/e-mail/USPS as needed to promote club events and work parties. Must use e-mail and computer.

OTHER SERVICE AREAS that may be considered upon your request

- **1. League Trap Shoot Coordinator** plans shoots ahead and contacts and organizes workers, provides expense report from each event. Approx. 3 -5 shoots/year *(we're really hurting for someone to manage this effort !!)*
- 2. Building Upkeep Committee plan and perform clubhouse or facility repairs and preventative maintenance tasks.
- **3.** Clubhouse Cleaner executes cleaning tasks according to ~1 hour procedure 3 or 4 times/month for 1 month duration.
- **4.** Club Development Committee analyze and prepare reports on options for club expansion or large scale upgrade. Plan and execute fund raising events.
- **5. Professional Training Instructor** assist or provide NYS DEC Hunter Education Courses (Gun, Bow, Trapping, or Waterfowl ID), NRA Training courses (rifle, shotgun, blackpowder, or pistol)
- **6. Secretary Assistant** Attend meetings, contact members as required, provide computer database, spreadsheet and e-mail support.
- 7. Trap Target delivery help with transportation and/or unloading of trap targets when purchased from Beicherk's in E. Rochester. Access to ³4 ton truck or large trailer is needed.
- **8. Trap Field Trainer** provides classroom and hands-on training to any members wishing to learn trap shooting and gain access to use trap house equipment.
- **9. Orientation Chairman** (need 1) handles new member orientations, prepares written "how to & who does" handouts. Contacts incoming members, gives orientation at club.
- **10. Orientation assistant -** assists with new member orientation sessions.
- **11. Rifle/pistol Range Manager** recommend and coordinate range modifications and associated rules and policies, maintain and update range safety signs.
- **12.** Clubhouse Rental Coordinator (need 1) Contact point for rentals, explains policies to user, holds cleaning deposit \$, verifies conditions and inventories, previews and communicates rental dates with other work teams to avoid schedule conflicts. Must use e-mail.
- **13.** Kitchen manager (need 1) Keep kitchen appliances and cupboards, pot, pans, utensils clean and organized.
- **14. Lawn Trimmer** (need 2, june + aug, july + sept.) do grass & weed trimming (weed whack) on & around range berms and club grounds.
